

# Certificate II in Transmission Line Construction (UET20422)

This traineeship provides the skills and knowledge to work in the electricity supply industry (ESI) as a transmission line construction worker. It covers safety and environment requirements, various high risk plant operations, assembling transmission structures, installing hardware and stringing transmission overhead conductors prior to being tensioned and terminated.

National high-risk work (HRW) licences are required for dogging and rigging as outlined on relevant state regulator websites.


### Eligibility & Suitability Requirements

- Must have a good level of English language, reading and writing skill
- Be able to carry out basic math calculations e.g. quantities & weights and interpreting load charts
- Be able to use digital devices such as calculator & online applications
- Have suitable physical capacity for manual tasks and ability to work at heights
- Be fit for work and use/wear suitable PPE, including height safety harness
- Be willing to undertake further work/study outside of class to prepare for the National HRW licence assessment
- Be over the age of 18 and provide proof of identity for National HRW licensing
- If completing a funded traineeship, must be living or working in NSW and an Australian/New Zealand citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder

Note: Some units require logbook/workplace tasks in addition to classroom attendance

*New entrants are fully funded under the NSW Government Smart & Skilled Program. Existing workers will need to pay a commercial fee.*
